Challenge Overview

The Opportunity

MIT Solve, in collaboration with The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, seeks solutions that will offer new ways of measuring primary health care performance improvement in low- and middle-income countries. To that end, this Challenge seeks novel and improved methods that:

- Employ unconventional or proxy data sources to inform primary health care performance improvement;
- Provide improved measurement methods that are low cost, fit-for-purpose, shareable across information systems, and streamlined for data collectors;
- Leverage existing systems, networks, and workflows to streamline the collection and interpretation of data to support meaningful use of primary health care data;
- Provide actionable, accountable, and accessible insights for health care providers, administrators, and/or funders that can be used to optimize the performance of primary health care; and
- Balance the opportunity for frontline health workers to participate in performance improvement efforts with their primary responsibility as care providers.

This Challenge seeks solutions that stand to advance the way that primary health care performance improvement happens in low- and middle-income countries. In order to ensure that selected solutions

are appropriate and practical for use in these countries, **the Challenge does not seek solutions that:**

- Require a high level of connectivity or bandwidth;
- Have been primarily designed for use in high-income countries; and/or
- Focus only on data collection.

The Context

Primary health care is a cornerstone of health care systems across the globe. The majority of a person's health needs—physical, mental, and social—are addressed by primary health care. Primary health care attends not only to individuals and families but also to the overall well-being of communities and their populations.

Despite its foundational role in communities everywhere, primary health care remains out of reach for millions of people, particularly in low- and middle-income countries. Barriers such as high cost, lack of access, insufficient availability, and inconsistent quality of care hold back people from living healthy and productive lives.

Improvements to primary health care are already happening in transformational ways: people are living longer; funding and incentives for high-quality care are on the rise; training and development for health care workers has renewed focus; and access to preventive health care and immunizations are improving patient health outcomes.

While performance improvement systems vary around the world, key indicators for measuring primary health care performance improvement are on hand. Despite having strong measurement

standards, limitations in how performance measurement occurs are common. These include:

- Lack of comprehensive vision and purpose for data collection;
- Poor quality or impractical data;
- Measurement that primarily informs funders rather than practical performance improvements;
- Inconsistent connectivity and adoption of real-time digital tools;
- Information or data systems that do not communicate with others;
- Burden of data collection being borne by frontline health workers; and
- Systems lack feedback mechanisms for data collectors themselves.

For progress to continue, diverse health care stakeholders, including patients, frontline health workers, policymakers, and everyone in between, need the means to understand what's working well and where further improvements are needed. While key indicators to measure the improvement of primary health care performance already exist, improvements and innovation are still urgently needed.

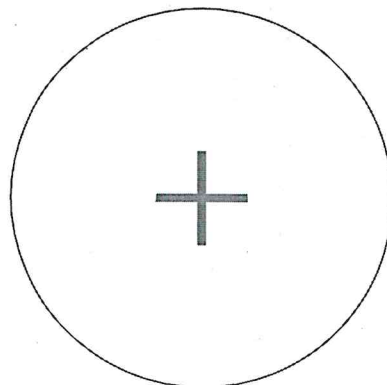

HOW TO APPLY TO A CHALLENGE

Not sure how to apply? Below are helpful
tips and tutorials to get you started.



Do you have a solution to a global problem? Apply to Solve's Global Challenges, which are open to anyone, anywhere in the world between February and March each year.

Finalists will be invited to pitch their solutions to a diverse panel of cross-sector judges, the Challenge Leadership Group. Selected teams will be announced at Solve Challenge Finals in September. These teams will be granted portions of available funding and take part in the nine-month Solver program, which includes coaching, mentorship, and networking opportunities to scale their solutions.

Not sure how to apply? Below are helpful tips to get you started.

Log in or create an account at solve.mit.edu/login and enter the required information to submit a solution to one of our Challenges. There are some questions on the "Select A Challenge" and "Solution Overview" pages that are required in order to submit your solution.

You can SAVE your application in two ways:

- Click CONTINUE to save your work and move to the next page, if you would like to keep working on your application.
- Click SAVE DRAFT & EXIT to save your work and exit the application for now, if you prefer to keep working later.
- Applications that are saved but not submitted before the deadline will not be considered.

You can SUBMIT your application by clicking SUBMIT SOLUTION.

- You must complete the required questions on the Solution Overview page in order to submit.
- Submit as soon as you are ready. We recommend submitting as soon as you have completed the required questions. You may log back in to edit your application at any time before the deadline.
- You must submit before the deadline for your submission to be considered.

- Clicking SUBMIT SOLUTION will make your application publicly viewable on Solve’s website.

You must click Submit Solution by the deadline to be considered for this Challenge. After you submit your Solution, you can still edit it until the deadline. No edits can be made after the deadline.

Tips for completing the application

Once you decide you would like to apply, begin your application as soon as you can. In post-application surveys, most applicants reported that they spent several hours completing the application. Be sure to budget enough time to submit your application before the deadline.

Keep in mind that all answers you submit are visible to the public unless they are denoted as “For Solve Use Only.” We hope that you are able to learn from and connect with other applicants through our platform! Please only

share information in your application that you are comfortable publicly sharing.

Only some of the questions in the application are required, and they all appear in the Solution Overview section. You must answer all the required questions in order to submit your application. But we strongly encourage you to complete the optional questions, too – applicants who answer most or all of the questions are more likely to be selected.

Your solution is not saved OR submitted automatically! Follow the directions below to make sure you don't lose your work. If you have an unstable internet connection, you may wish to use this list of application questions to work offline, then copy-paste your answers into the application.

Support with your Application

Even if you don't already have a business and impact plan for your solution, that's okay -- the application will take you through core questions with resources to help. Look for links to resources in the questions' help text.

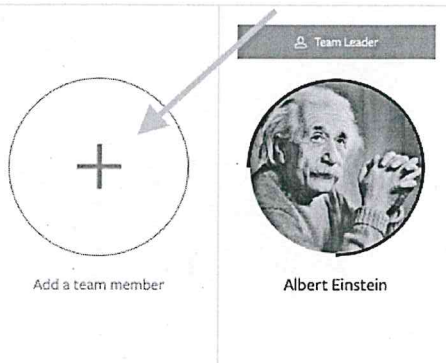
Solve staff will be available to answer questions about the Challenges and the application at several online application clinics during the application period. You can get more information and register on [Solve's Events page](#).

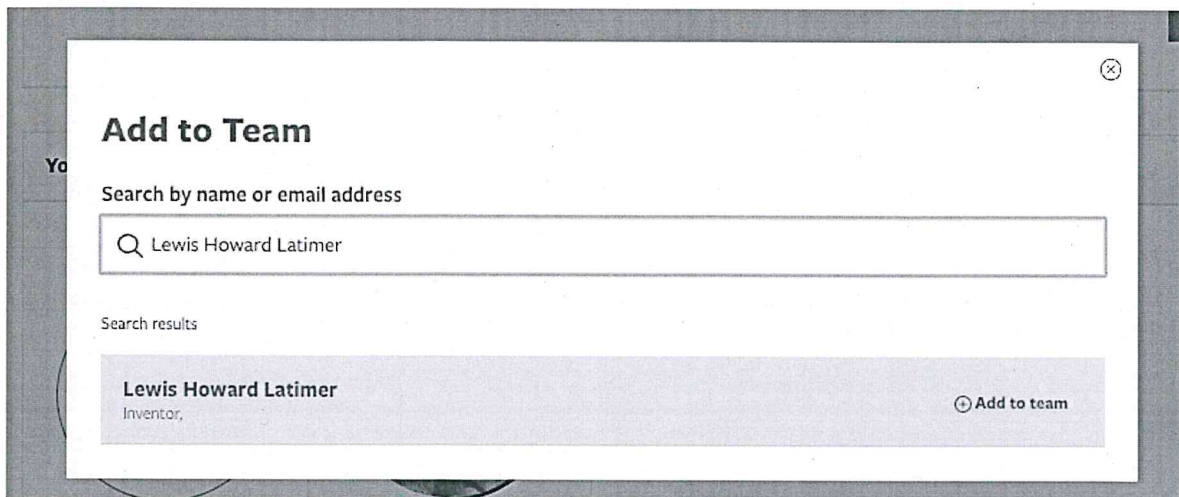
How to Add Team Members to Your Application

Adding Team Members to your application allows multiple users to edit your application and enables you to collaborate on your responses. To add Team Members, open your Dashboard and go to "Edit Your Solution." At the bottom of your application, click the "Add a team member" button.

Your Team



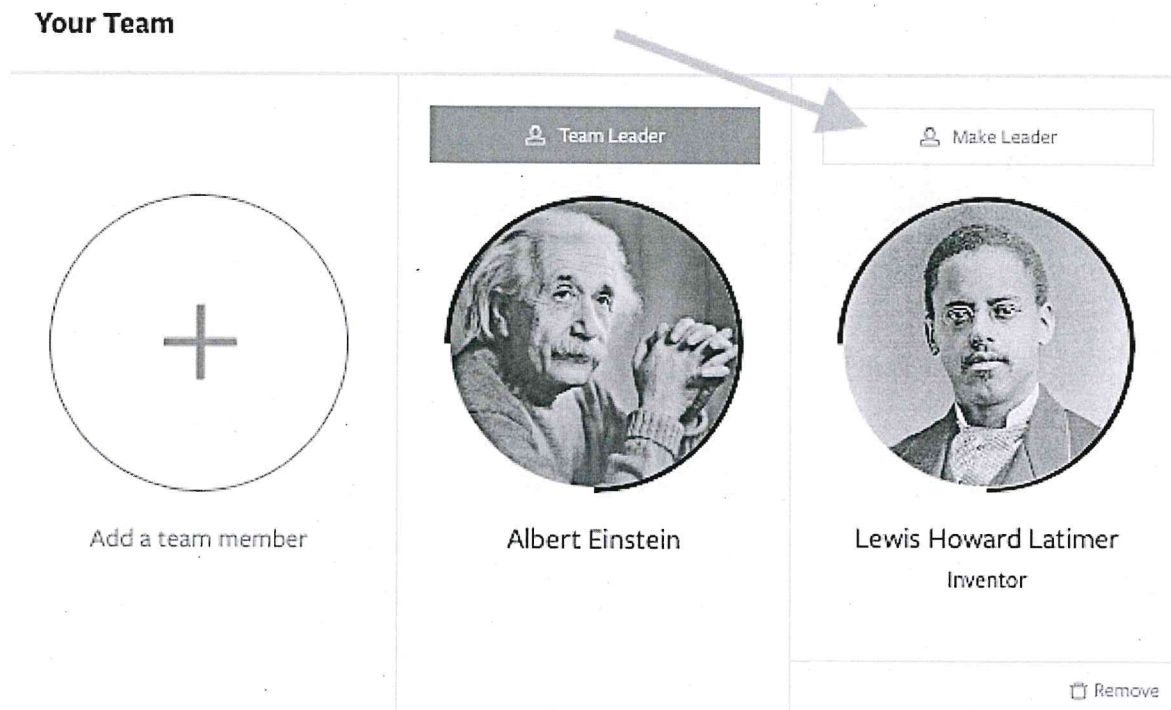
If a Team Member already has a Solve user account, search for them here and send them an invitation to join your application team. If they do not have an account, type in their email address and send them an invitation to create an account and join your application as a Team Member.



Once you have added your Team Members, choose your Team Lead. The Team Lead will be the only user who can add or remove users from the application.

The person you identify as Team Lead should be the CEO or Executive Director of the solution organization (or, in some special cases, the Team Lead may be another member of the executive team). They should be the person who is responsible for the strategic direction of the solution. If your solution is selected as a Finalist, this person will be expected to pitch the solution at Solve Challenge Finals, and if selected as a Solver, they will be the lead participant in the Solver program.

To select your Team Lead, click the “Make Leader” button above the user’s photo.



How does Solve’s platform work?

Solve’s award-winning open innovation platform was designed based on 10 years of research conducted by the Climate CoLab, a project of the MIT Center for Collective Intelligence, which studies how people and computers can be connected so that collectively, they can act more intelligently than any one person, group, or computer has ever done before.

Anyone, anywhere in the world can submit a solution to open innovation Challenges hosted on Solve’s platform. **All submitted solutions will appear publicly on our open innovation platform.**

Users may also comment and vote on published solutions, which are visible on Solve’s website. All judging is completed inside the platform, with solutions assigned to specific judges to review and evaluate. Applications are not formally reviewed by the MIT Solve team or judges until after the application deadline.
