

Faculty of Pharmacy Announcement Student Admission to the Doctor of Pharmacy Program (International Program), Faculty of Pharmacy, Direct Admission (Round 3), Academic Year 2025

The Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University, is now accepting applications for the Doctor of Pharmacy Program (International Program) for the Direct Admission (Round 3), Academic Year 2025. The following details are hereby announced by The Faculty of Pharmacy has established the following admission criteria.

1. The total admission is 24 candidates.

2. Admission requirements

- 2.1 General eligibility requirements
 - 1) Applicants must be of Thai nationality or other nationality, and must be at least 16 years of age as of the commencement date of the first semester of the 2025 academic year.
 - 2) Non-Thai applicants must possess a valid passport from their country of citizenship. This passport must maintain validity for a minimum of six months beyond the final day of the application period. Furthermore, applicants are required to obtain a visa for entry into Thailand for the purposes of interviews and medical clearance, at the designated date and time.
 - 3) Applicants must not be currently enrolled in any Pharmacy program at a public university in Thailand, unless they officially withdraw from such program prior to submitting their application.
 - 4) Applicants must have a person who will financially support their tuition fees and other study-related expenses until the completion of the program.
 - 5) For Thai nationals only, applicants must not possess a confirmed admission status within the TCAS system for the 2025 academic year at any institution. The Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University, will verify applicant eligibility through the he TCAS database of the Council of University Presidents of Thailand.
 - 6) Applicants must demonstrate good behavior and certify to Mahidol University their intention to study to the best of their abilities. They must also agree to adhere strictly to all existing and future rules and regulations of Mahidol University.

/7) Applicants...

- 7) Applicants must be in good health and free from the following conditions: serious psychiatric disorders that may pose a risk to oneself and/or others, serious contagious diseases, deafness, muteness, physical deformities that could hinder the study and practice of pharmacy. Additionally, the Admission Committee of the Doctor of Pharmacy Program (International program), Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University, may determine those other illnesses or disabilities could also hinder the study and practice of pharmacy. Applicants must provide a medical certificate as confirmation.
 - **Remarks:** 1. Eligible applicants must submit a medical investigation form along with the requested results.
 - 2. The assessment of diseases, symptoms, or physical deformities mentioned in Clause 7 is at the discretion of the Admission Committee of the Doctor of Pharmacy Program (International program), Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University, and their decision is considered final.

2.2 General eligibility requirements

- 1) Educational qualifications:
 - A. Graduating from Thai High Schools (M.6) without a specified study plan

 OR graduating from International High Schools with Grade 12 in the American system or Year 13 in the English system
 - OR obtaining a certificate equivalent to the criteria set by the Ministry of Education, in accordance with the Ministry of Education regulations regarding the comparison of domestic and foreign educational qualifications at the level of basic education B.E. 2563 (documents confirmation).
 - B. High school transcripts must include three science-mathematics subjects, which should include:1) Chemistry 2) Biology 3) Physics and/or 4) Mathematics.
- 2) Test scores are as follows:
 - A. A cumulative grade point average (GPAX) at least 3.00
 - 1) For Graduate Students, a cumulative grade point average (GPAX) must be shown for 6 semesters.
 - 2) For current Students, a cumulative grade point average (GPAX) must be shown for 5 semesters. (Academic Year 2022 and 2023).
 - B. A total score of the IB Diploma must be at least 35 points out of 45 points. Alternatively, a total score of International A Level must be at least ABB in three subjects from the science-mathematics subjects: 1) Chemistry, 2) Biology, 3) Physics, and 4) Mathematics. However, applicants studying under the Basic Education Core Curriculum may not be required to present a total score of the IB Diploma or International A Level.
 - Remarks: Graduates of high school with other foreign curriculums are also eligible to apply. Consideration and approval will be under the Admission Committee of the Doctor of Pharmacy Program (International program), Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University.

- 2.3 The standardized test scores must have been obtained within a two-year period, calculated from the test date to the scheduled interview date, as follows:
 - 1) Knowledge Standardized Test Scores (Minimum Score Requirements):
 - Thai Biomedical admission test (TBAT) score: No minimum score is required. OR
 - The Biomedical admission test (BMAT) score: No minimum score is required. OR
 - The SAT Subject Test (SAT II) score is at least 650 in each of three subjects: 1) Biology M
 2) Chemistry 3) Physics or Mathematics 2. OR
 - Other Knowledge standardized test scores.
 - 2) English Language Standardized Test Scores (Minimum Score Requirements):
 - A TOEFL Internet-based (TOEFL iBT) score of at least 79 OR
 - IELTS Academic Test score of at least 6.5 OR
 - Other English language standardized test scores.

Remarks: Graduates presenting alternative Knowledge and English Language standardized test scores are eligible for consideration, with the final evaluation and approval resting with the Admission Committee of the Doctor of Pharmacy Program (International Program), Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University.

3. Application process and required documents

- 3.1 Applicants are required to thoroughly review the details provided in the official admission announcement. (Applicants are advised to independently review all information for their own benefit.)
- 3.2 Applications must be submitted through the online system at https://pharmacy.mahidol. ac.th/interprogram/registration/
- 3.3 Upload all application documents as follows:
 - 1) Submit a profile picture size width 180-500 pixels and height 200-600 pixels, straight-faced photo, wearing a school uniform or formal outfit (without hat or sunglasses), against a white or blue background. The photo should be taken within the past 6 months, not digitally modified, and scanned as a JPEG-format file (.jpeg or .jpg), with a file size not exceeding 2 MB.
 - 2) Fill out the application form completely as required, sign it with a blue ink pen, and scan it as a PDF file with a file size not exceeding 2 MB.
 - 3) Provide a photocopy of your identification card (front side only) or passport on A4 size paper. Additionally, sign these two documents with a blue ink pen, scan them as PDF files with a file size not exceeding 2 MB. If the name or last name on the ID card or passport does not match other documents, provide a certified copy of the name change, sign it with a blue ink pen, scan it as a PDF file, and save all documents as one PDF file.
 - 4) Submit a photocopy of the house registration for Thai applicants or proof of residence in Thailand for non-Thai applicants on A4 size paper. Sign these two documents with a blue ink pen, scan them as PDF files with a file size not exceeding 2 MB.

- 5) Academic documents must be copied onto A4-sized paper. Applicants are required to sign these documents with a blue ink pen, and subsequently scan them into a single PDF file. In cases where a document comprises two pages, both the front and back sides must be scanned. The total file size must not exceed 2 MB. The following documents are required:
 - A. <u>High School Certificate or Bona Fide Certificate:</u> A copy of the high school certificate OR a bona fide certificate indicating the student's expected graduation status in the 2024 academic year.
 - B. <u>Predicted IB Diploma or International A-Level Scores:</u> IB Diploma and International A-Level students must submit a certified record indicating their predicted IB Diploma score or predicted International A-Level score.
 - C. Official High School Transcript: A copy of the official high school transcript is required.
- 6) Score reports for Knowledge and English Language standardized tests must be copied onto A4-sized paper. Applicants are required to sign these documents with a blue ink pen and subsequently scan them into a single PDF file. In cases where a score report comprises two pages, both the front and back sides must be scanned. The total file size must not exceed 2 MB.
- 7) The Statement of Purpose must explain the applicant's reasons and motivations for applying to the Doctor of Pharmacy program (International Program), as well as their life goals. It should be between 500 and 800 words, formatted using Times New Roman, 12-point font size, and single-line spacing. The Statement of Purpose must be saved as a PDF file, with a file size not exceeding 2 MB.
- 8) Portfolio, with file size not exceeding 20 MB, and should include the following information:
 - A. <u>Topic Selection</u>: (Choose ONE topic from the following four options) 1. Academic Achievements 2. Artistic Pursuits 3. Leadership Experience and 4 Social Responsibility Initiatives (Present 2-3 activities/works directly related to the selected topic.)
 - B. Language: Present all activities/works in English only.
 - C. <u>Format:</u> Present activities/works in a vertical format, using A4-sized pages. Avoid using animations or video, and save the portfolio as a PDF file.
 - D. Page Layout: Presenting all the information within 5 pages
 - Page 1: Provide a concise introductory profile of the applicant. Include a brief description of the selected topic. Articulate the rationale for the chosen topic selection.
 - Pages 2-5: Include photos of the activities/works, along with a brief description for each.
- 9) The bank deposit slip confirming payment of the application fee, as received from the bank, must be scanned to a PDF file with a file size not exceeding 2 MB. The applicant must pay the application fee in the full amount of 3,400 Thai baht (THB), which is non-refundable. Online banking services are acceptable for payment. The depositor's name must exactly match the applicant's legal first and last name. The applicant is responsible for any fees charged by the bank or any currency exchange rate discrepancies. 10) The applicant must download the student's health record form of the faculty at link: https://shorturl.at/2qBWx It must be certified by a public hospital or a private hospital as specified in section 2.1 (7).

Remarks: The applicant must show the student's health record form of the faculty (Original documents) on the date of the interview.

- 11) Applicants are required to verify the accuracy of all information in their application via the online application system before confirming their application. Once the application information has been confirmed, applicants must print the application form from the system and affix their signature and full name. Should you require any data modification after confirming your application, please directly contact Ms. Parnphat, the staff of the International Pharmacy School, via email at parnphat.gat@mahidol.ac.th to proceed with the data correction request only.
- 3.4 Recommendation letters from two of the applicant's teachers should include the details as follows:
 - 1) The letter should introduce and recommend the applicant for acceptance into the Doctor of Pharmacy program (International Program).
 - 2) The letter should be printed in English or Thai and should not exceed 1 page of A4 paper, the school seal should be affixed and sealed.
 - 3) The applicant or teachers can be directly sent the letters out from the applicant's school to the Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University (Doctor of Pharmacy program (International Program)). Alternatively, the applicants can submit the letters together with other application documents.
- 3.5 All application documents must be sent by postal mail or private logistic companies

The Faculty of Pharmacy shall not be liable for any refund of application fees or other charges under any circumstances.
 - In the event of an error made by the applicant or if it is found that the applications are incorrect or fraudulent, the applicant will be disqualified.
 - The Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University will collect information from applicants and retain their data for a period of one year and six months for statistical analysis and research to improve quality and processes and to verify application evidences.
 - The eligibility of applicants for the interview, and pharmacy aptitude test will be determined by the Admission Committee of the Doctor of Pharmacy Program (International program), which has the right to make final conclusion.

5. Examination methods and admission criteria

5.1 Interview scores (The interview will be conducted in English.)	30%
5.2 Academic achievement	30%
5.3 Pharmacy aptitude test scores (Written Examination)	30%
5.4 Portfolio and statement of purpose	10%

Remarks: Admission consideration is at the discretion of the Admission Committee of the Doctor of Pharmacy Program, which has the right to make final conclusion.

6. Confirmation of Enrollments

Candidates who have passed the selection process are required to confirm their enrollment with the Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University, within the specified period. Failure to confirm enrollment within the designated timeframe will be considered a forfeiture of their admission rights, and no claims for such rights can be made thereafter. (The Faculty will announce the specific schedule in the announcement of the list of successful candidates.)

7. Criteria for evaluating English proficiency for degree approval

Undergraduate students must pass an English proficiency test before graduation, following the conditions and criteria established by the university. This requirement is considered as one of the considerations for degree approval, in accordance with the Mahidol University Regulations on Diploma and Undergraduate Studies and the Mahidol University Announcement on English Competence Standards for Undergraduate Students of Mahidol University B.E. 2566 (2023) Announced on 20 December, 2023

8. English proficiency test

Mahidol University offers a MU-ELT English Language Proficiency Test at no cost for newly enrolled students, limited to one-time use. Detailed information regarding test scheduling and administration can be accessed through official announcements released. In addition, students who have already obtained English proficiency test scores, Mahidol University supports various recognized tests in accordance with its English Language Proficiency for Undergraduate Programs. As per the university's announcement for the academic year 2023, students are permitted to submit English proficiency test scores taken within two years prior to the commencement of the semester.
